# **BABEL by Jaqueline Goldfinger** Wednesday, April 10 at 7:30pm



In this version of a near future society, prospective parents learn within the first weeks of conception which traits their child will have and what behaviors it is likely to exhibit. Based on these test results, they are either issued a PRE certification which legally guarantees the baby will be a "good" person or not. Without the certification, the child will be limited in what it is allowed to do. Two couples, both early in their pregnancies, collide over what to do with their PRE certification test results. With rapid advances in reproductive technology, modern eugenics is science's Wild West. What will we do to "civilize" it and ourselves? How far will we go when playing God?
