About the playwright:

Mary Ethel Schmidt received her MFA from Mason Gross School of the Arts, Rutgers University, where she was the recipient of the Levin Scholarship for three years. In New York City she studied at the Classic Stage Company, was a founding member of the Metropolitan Playhouse and worked at the Director's Company, where she received a Revson Fellowship to study directing and then continued on as Associate Artistic Director. While in New York, Schmidt was member of the Associate Faculty at the American Academy of Dramatic Arts, where she taught acting and directed over 50 productions. She has acted in and directed numerous productions in New York, New

Jersey, and Pennsylvania, including several projects with the Centenary Stage Company. An accomplished playwright, her plays have been performed in New York City, Seattle, and Kansas City. Internationally she has studied at the National theatre, directed the Swedish Premiere of Nicky Silver's Raised in Captivity and performed The Belle of Amherst and Wenceslas Square in Vilnius, Lithuania. She is a member of Actors Equity Association and The Society of Stage Directors and Choreographers.

About the playwright:

Christine Evans' plays have been produced and awarded in Australia, the US and the UK. Selected production highlights include *Trojan Barbie* at the ART, the Garage Theater, Playbox Theatre (UK) and Charing Cross Theatre (UK); Weightless, Mothergun and All Souls' Day at Perishable Theatre; Slow Falling Bird at Crowded Fire, and in Australia, My Vicious Angel at Belvoir St. Theatre, Vitalstatistix, and the Adelaide International Festival of the Arts. Her plays are published by Samuel French (*Trojan Barbie*) Smith and Kraus (*Best Monologues, 2010*) and *Theater Forum*. NoPassport publishes her anthology, War Plays, in 2013.

Honors include a Rockefeller Foundation Bellagio Center Award, a Fulbright Award, Perishable's International Women's Playwriting Competition, the Jane Chambers Playwriting Award, Plays for the 21st Century Award, the Rella Lossy Playwright Award and the 2009 and 2013 Rhode Island State Council on the Arts (RISCA) Playwriting Fellowship. Evans is a Resident Artist at HERE (NY) and a Core Member of the Playwrights' Center. She holds an M.F.A. and Ph.D. from Brown and joined the Georgetown Department of Performing Arts faculty in 2012.
