Mary Poindexter McLaughlin: I hold a BA in English from Stanford University, where I was the recipient of Stanford's Golden Grant Award for playwriting, and an MA in Theatre & Performance Studies from the University at Buffalo. My plays have been performed in NYC, Buffalo, NY, CT, CO, and PA, where I was the Donna Award Runner-Up for Outstanding Playwright at the 2017 Pittsburgh New Works Festival (Doing Time). Most recently, my play The Buddha's Wife took first prize in the 2019 Henley Rose Playwright Competition and was

named a Finalist in The Landing Theatre's 2020 New American Voices Festival. My poems have been published in Stanford Magazine, my essays are featured by DailyClout, and I co-wrote a memoir with Todd Norian. I am currently at work on a full-length Shakespeare-based feminist drama. A former actor in NYC, I also direct and teach theatre arts. Member: Dramatists Guild, SAG-AFTRA.

Denny and Claire have retired to the wilds of Central America, where they quickly discover that things are not as they were expecting, neither in their relationship, nor in their new property, where a mysterious Mound is discovered by a pair of archaeologists who arrive on the scene, making a shattering discovery which will challenge all their beliefs about what is ever truly real and what is imagined.



Christine Foster's plays have been produced in the UK, Canada, New Zealand, Australia, Thailand, Denmark, Mexico, Korea and the US, and on CBS, CTV, History and the Family Channel. In 2018 she won the Marion Thauer Brown New Audio Drama Award and her full-length Four Thieves Vinegar ran successfully in London before being remounted at the Brighton Fringe in 2019. Her monologue Cousins was the winner of the Soundworks.co.uk Contest in 2020. Recent short pieces have been performed on podcasts, BBC

Radio, and WBRH Scotland, and she currently has two new full-length plays scheduled to premiere in the UK in 2022-23.
